Course Description: Infection Prevention is essential for the health and safety of patients and dental health professionals. In order to prevent the transmission of microorganisms and disease requires breaking the chain of infection. This entails performing a series of repeatable and sequential steps for effective infection prevention. The CDC recommendations on infection control for the dental setting include Standard Precautions that should be followed on a daily basis, and includes procedures to be performed at the beginning of the day, before and after treating each patient and at the end of the day. The objective of this course is to provide the dental healthcare professional with an overview of current infection prevention protocols that are required to break the chain of infection and prevent disease transmission.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, the participants will be able to:

1. Review the elements of Standard Precautions recommended for effective infection prevention
2. Describe engineering and work controls that help prevent the transmission of bloodborne pathogens and other microorganisms
3. Implement effective infection prevention using a sequential and systematic approach that follows the CDC recommendations

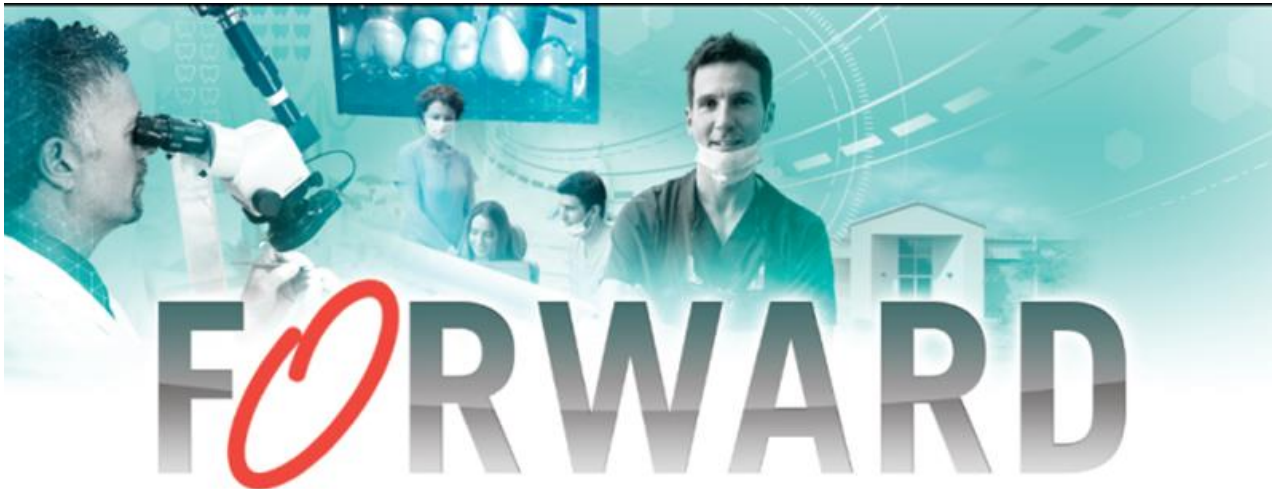

Mark Malcolm Francis December 18, 1960 - June 11, 2018



Dr. Mark Francis died unexpectedly this past June 11th from a tragic accident at his home in Sisters, Oregon. Mark was born at the old Scripps Hospital on Prospect St. in 1960. He grew up in La Jolla with his father and mother: Jack and Marilyn; and his four siblings: Kathleen, Cole, Robert and Barry. Aside from family, Mark's passions of old La Jolla included his friends, diving, fishing,

photography and ice skating. In his early years, Mark could be found at the Children's Pool with his younger brother, Barry, fishing for bass, perch and opaleye; or perhaps near Bird Rock learning to dive with his brother, Robert. Over the years, Mark grew in his abilities in many ways. He became certified in SCUBA at 14 years-of-age and developed a natural eye for photography. Mark combined these two skills capturing both under and above water photographs for the likes of National Geographic while working along-side many world-renowned photographers. While at LJ High School, Mark first met the love of his life, Laurie Steele. Following high school, they fell in love and were married in August of 1984. They both then moved northward where Mark attended UC Santa Cruz, and then to UC Riverside where he finished his Bachelor's degree in Biology. In-step with his undergrad studies, Mark researched penguins at Sea World, elephant seals at UCSC and humpback whales at SIO. Soon after, Mark decided to follow in his father's and grandfather's footsteps to become a dentist, degreed through Loma Linda University in 1992. Mark's journey would then take him and his family to Sisters, Oregon. There, he and Laurie raised their two daughters Ashlee and Kaylee, established a dental practice for Central Oregon, built a home, and befriended many through his work, the churches they attended and other various avenues. Mark had a passion for people. He would humbly, and often sacrificially, serve his fellow human in any way he could. Mark assisted those from Central Oregon to San Diego to the rivers and tributaries of the Amazon Forest - and many, many places in-between. His dental skills were keen and noted in his profession. He taught college courses at Oregon Health Sciences Institute and assisted the FBI with forensic dental analyses. In his late 40s, Mark incurred an injury in his upper spine, hampering his ability to practice dentistry and many of his personal passions in life. He was forced into an early retirement from dentistry. Despite this apparent set-back, Mark always sought the best in life's trials and soon found many ways to continue to live his life fully with his family, the church and his friends. It was during this time period that Mark returned to a childhood passion, but this time with a twist. He became an avid fly fisherman. This led to serene reflection at the local rivers of the Metolius and Deschutes, and to travels with his brothers throughout the world. Mark's final fishing trip with his brothers was this past April, one that epitomized his love of God's creation at the remarkable Pacific atoll of Kiritibati. Throughout his life, Mark was quiet and reserved. Yet, he was a champion for others and a hero to many. His wit was dry, but very funny. He thought before he spoke. The smile on his face would always leave one feeling at ease with life. His compassion and kindness exhibited his life wherever it would take him; being loved and enjoyed by those who entered into his life, whether just for a season or for a lifetime. Mark is survived by his wife, Laurie, his two daughters, Ashlee and Kaylee, his new grandson, Kaenon, his mother, Marilyn, and the remainder of his siblings and their respective families. God has finished His work in Mark, calling him home to enjoy him more completely. His family would like to thank all of those who made an impact on Mark's life, whether being served or serving. He delighted in so much of life, one that, without each of you, would lose a bit of color, some laughter and Mark's wonderful smile. At the Kemple Memorial Children's Dental Clinic, our mission is to improve the health and well-being of children in Central Oregon by facilitating critical preventative, educational, and dental treatment services for children whose families cannot access basic dental care. We do this through our dental clinic facility screen and seal program events at local schools and community partner organization venues with subsequent follow-up and referrals to volunteer dental professionals as needed. We provide portable preventative dental services to children and young adults regardless of insurability at various convenient locations. We advocate for all children needing timely, high-quality dental care.

ANNOUNCEMENT- KEMPLE CLINIC CELEBRATES 20 YEARS OF SERVICE: This fall, during our Annual Appeal, Kemple Clinic will be celebrating our 20th year of service to the Central Oregon Community with several media announcements, pictures, etc. This year's Kemple Clinic Fall Fundraiser is unique in that we are celebrating our 20th BIRTHDAY – 20 years of service to the community. We hope to expand our outreach for community funding, bringing history forward to old and new residents of our region and exposing them to the continuing issues surrounding the oral health of our youth in Central Oregon. **Attached is the Birthday Card (print-ready artwork)** that we will be sending out next week with an Annual Appeal for Donations letter to our current donor data base. If you would like copies of the printed BD card for your office to post as well as return donation envelopes, please let us know. Anything you can do to encourage community support for and donations to Kemple Clinic is always appreciated.

BRIGHTER SMILES CAMPAIGN – (whitening fundraiser). During September, The Bend Bulletin published the **enclosed thank you advertisement** listing the names of the dentists who supported our fundraiser. We also announced our results and matching grant achievement. With your help, we received the matching grant of \$20,000, giving us a total of \$52,600 for the Brighter Smiles Campaign. Once again...Way to Go!! You Rock!!

Kemple Clinic now provides preventative and diagnostic dental care for OHP patients. The lack of *access to and continuity of preventative dental care* for the uninsured, underinsured, and underserved, as well as OHP patients, creates a new focus on who is "at risk". The implementation of SB 558 (Cover all Kids), the increase in OHP members,

and the resultant priority of urgent/emergent care appointments, have made regular, preventative dental visits difficult for OHP members to obtain and/or reschedule in a timely manner. Given that many of these formerly uninsured children have been our patients for several years, *referred to many of you in the past for volunteered dental care*, Kemple Clinic will be providing a suite of preventative/diagnostic services to OHP children whose families are having difficulty obtaining regular dental visits. To do so, we have partnered with Advantage Dental, Capitol Dental, MODA/ODS and Willamette Dental to provide those preventative services in our clinic facility. All four DCO's have agreed to a fee schedule for Kemple Clinic reimbursement. As we identify urgent/emergent dental issues, we will work with the DCO's to facilitate referrals to the appropriate OHP provider. While this represents only 25% of our clinic's targeted underserved population, caring for OHP children is critical to our region's success in reducing the negative effects of poor oral health.

Dear Dr. Rupert,

I am appalled, aghast and grossed out when adult patients come to my office with a mouth full of food and crud between and around their teeth. It shows a lack of respect to me, and a lack of basic understanding of the most essential oral hygiene measures on the part of the patient. What do you recommend doing when we see an adult patient like that?

Dear Tired of Being Grossed Out,

Quit being such a baby! A lot of us went to Dental School, just so we could be grossed out on a regular and daily basis!

You are going about this all wrong! First and foremost, your job is not to personalize the patient's inability to brush or floss regularly. That is not a reflection on your failure as a dentist to educate that patient about the preventive importance of routine dental care and hygiene. That lack of responsibility and initiative rests with that adult patient, and instead of personalizing or feeling grossed out or appalled that they have the nerve to come to the dentist with a mouth full of goop in between their teeth or under their partials, you need to have a little fun at the office at their expense.

Whenever I see a patient with a mouth full of goop around their teeth or under their partials, I ask them if they have been brushing regularly? Almost 100% of the time, they lie and tell me that they brush all the time! I then look at my dental assistant with a knowing smile and ask them to take an alginate impression of the patient's mouth.

I come back three minutes later and look at the alginate impression with the patient. Alginate does a great job of sticking to all kinds of goop, food particles and crud that's sitting on the teeth. I show the impression to the patient, and much like the disclosing tablets with the kids ... and without saying a word ... their faces turn red and they start talking to me like a priest at a confessional!

I get to hear how busy they've been and how they didn't get a chance to brush for an entire month and a whole bunch of other exaggerations. I then charge them an Oral Hygiene Instruction fee and that usually makes me enjoy the experience a whole lot more than when I used to be grossed out, aghast or upset that patients showed up for their dental appointments with food and goop all over their teeth.
