**Ove Peters, DMD, PhD** is a diplomate of the American Board of Endodontists and is professor and co-chair of the department of endodontics at the Arthur A. Dugoni School of Dentistry at the University of the Pacific, San Francisco. He is also the director of the Advanced Education Program in Endodontology. He maintains a private practice in the Bay Area.

The clinical practice of endodontics has dramatically changed over the last two decades, mainly driven by technological advances. There are exciting new possibilities: for example the increasing use of cone-beam computed tomography (CBCT) or the introduction of novel nickel-titanium instruments and new obturation materials. Today's clinician should keep updated about such technologies in order to select best practices and serve the goal: teeth that can last a lifetime. This course will provide a very comprehensive and evidence-based update on all aspects of contemporary endodontic therapy.
