7/19/17 - Intra Oral Scanning

Come join us for an exciting introduction to our new technology we are incorporating into our practice. In this evening program we will discuss the advantages to you and your practice of intra oral scanning. Video Presentation: Eric van Dooren: Optimizing soft tissue outcomes: achieving long-term success in dental implant treatment (Part 1 & Part 2).

Description

The lecture reviews the parameters for soft tissue evaluation and clinical procedures for soft tissue conditioning, with both non-surgical and surgical techniques. To get sufficient information for proper planning it is important to make use of comprehensive diagnostic tools, like tomograms, initial wax-up, patient photos etc. Dr van Dooren explains that soft tissue stability and thickness endorse long-term bone stability and that soft tissue esthetics and condition take time and improve with time. Dr van Dooren highlights the importance of connective tissue grafts for sufficient soft tissue volume and the importance of minimizing crestal bone compression by appropriate implant design, and reviews the influence of different abutment construction types, materials and designs on soft tissue appearance and contour.

Video Presentation: David Garcia Baeza: The art of individualized prosthetics in the aesthetic zone and the way to the optimum result.

Description

Reaching for an aesthetic end-result involves optimized soft tissue protocols. The use of provisional restorations gives advantages and makes the final prosthetic steps easier to achieve an excellent esthetic result. The handling of the soft tissue and its manipulation at the right time is crucial for the aesthetic outcomes. But how and when should it be done?

The lecturer will focus on today's knowledge and the influence the abutment design has on the transmucosal region to support final outcomes.
